



Rideshare

Check out these new options for sharing the ride.

Waze Carpool is an app from Waze that matches riders with drivers who are traveling along the same routes.

It's a quick and affordable option for getting to and from Burbank. Download the Waze Carpool app available for IOS and Android.

Via is a rideshare service that has partnered with Metro to provide reduced fare trips within the City of Burbank. Riders can book rides with Via's smartphone app, or by calling 619-731-0710 Monday to Friday, 6am-8pm.

UberPool and Lyft Shared, which allow multiple users to share the same ride, also operate extensively in the San Fernando Valley and are much cheaper when used to decrease commute times between transit stops for those first and last miles!



Walk

Daily errands do not require a car. Walk to a subway station or bus stop in minutes and connect to Downtown LA, Hollywood Burbank Airport, Universal City, Hollywood and more!

Trains

Trains connect from Burbank to the entire region. And bikes are welcome on trains!

Metrolink serves as the Los Angeles region's commuter rail line. Two different lines run through Burbank serving the Downtown Burbank and Airport North and South stations.

For **Metrolink** routes and schedules, and to purchase tickets, visit metrolinktrains.com.

The **Metro Red Line** connects Burbank to Downtown LA in under an hour. Burbank's Media District is easily reached from the Universal City stop, while connections to downtown Burbank are more frequent from the North Hollywood stop. For Red Line routes and schedules, visit metro.net.

Bus

There are a host of bus operators that serve routes in the City. **Metro** and **Burbank Bus** operate throughout Burbank.

It's easy to pay for bus trips, too, by loading passes or "stored value" onto your **TAP** card.



Bike

Burbank's system of bike lanes is becoming increasingly connected, too.

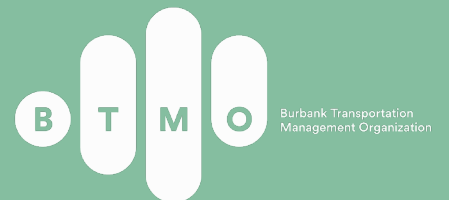
