Rideshare

Metro Micro is a new on-demand rideshare service that is now serving the North Hollywood/Burbank area! Ride for just \$1 per ride, and pay using your TAP card or credit card. Book your ride today by downloading the Metro Micro app available on iOS and Android, or by using the Metro Micro booking website at metro.net/micro

Waze Carpool is an app from Waze that matches riders with drivers who are traveling along the same routes. It's a quick and affordable option for getting to and from Burbank. Download the Waze Carpool app available for IOS and Android, or visit wazecarpool.com for more info.

UberPool and Lyft Shared, which allow multiple users to share the same ride, also operate extensively in the San Fernando Valley and are much cheaper when used to decrease commute times between transit stops for those first and last miles!



Walk

Hit the Streets. Walking around Burbank is easy! Burbank's Downtown, Media District and Magnolia Park area offer transit accessible areas for safe walking with access to retail, food, and more.

Daily errands do not require a car. Walk to a subway station or bus stop in minutes and connect to Downtown LA, Hollywood Burbank Airport, Universal City, Hollywood and more!

Trains

Metrolink serves as the LA region's commuter rail service, with two lines operating through Burbank, serving Downtown Burbank and the Airport North and South stations.

For Metrolink routes and schedules, and to purchase tickets, visit metrolinktrains.com.

The Metro B (Red) Line connects Burbank to Downtown LA in under an hour. Burbank's Media District is easily reached from the Universal City station, while connections to downtown Burbank are more frequent from the North Hollywood station. For Red Line routes and schedules, visit metro.net.




There are a host of bus operators that serve routes in the City. Metro and Burbank Bus operate throughout Burbank.

Bus

Bike

Burbank's system of bike lanes is becoming increasingly connected as well.
