The California Air Resources Board (CARB) is providing **up to \$2,000** in **e-bike vouchers** for Californians who meet the income requirements. It is a **first-come**, **first served basis**,

but a portion of funding will be set aside for low-income and disadvantaged residents. Vouchers can be used to buy a new class one through three or EN-15194 compliant electric bike. It must have a motor of 750 watts or less, operable pedals, and battery integrated lights. Applicants must be 18 years of older and a California resident

Metro has approved \$135 million for the pre-construction phase of the North Hollywood to Pasadena Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) project. The project will extend 19 miles with 22 stations, connecting the Metro A Line Memorial Park Station in Pasadena to the Metro B and G Line North Hollywood Station.

California Approves \$1.4 Billion to Build More Zero-Emission Vehicle Infrastructure





The California Energy Commission approved \$1.4 billion to accelerate the state's electric vehicle and hydrogen refueling goals. The investments are intended to fund infrastructure for light, medium, and heavy-duty zero-emission vehicles (ZEV) and expand the charging and hydrogen refueling network. California transit agencies must convert to ZEVs by 2040 per the Innovative Clean Transit regulation, and improving electric charging and hydrogen refueling infrastructure will help ensure a smoother transition.

The Newsom Administration is prioritizing clean fuel production, public transit and rail infrastructure enhancements, and a cleaner, smarter electric grid to help power it all.
