Safe Streets Burbank

- Also known as Vision Zero
- Goal is to eliminate traffic fatalities and severe injuries
- Initiated in January 2024 per City Council Direction



Safe Streets Burbank

- 1. Collision landscape analysis
- 2. Systemic safety analysis
- 3. High Injury Network assessment
- 4. Countermeasure toolbox
- 5. Project identification
- 6. Final plan







Paid Parking in Downtown Burbank

- October 2023: Council directed staff to develop a parking management plan for downtown Burbank
- Limited implementation
- Returning to Council in the summer




- On Monday, October 23, Metrolink implemented a schedule change expanding weekday and weekend service on the Antelope Valley (AV) Line.
- The enhanced schedule meets the changing needs of riders and provides a preview of what regional passenger rail service could look like across our entire system soon.
- On Oct. 20, 2023, elected officials and dignitaries held a ribbon cutting ceremony to introduce the new Vista Canyon Station.



Mobility-4-All

California EBT cardholders are eligible for an additional 50% fare discount.

- Simply insert California EBT card into Metrolink ticket vending machines to unlock the 50% discount.
- Available only at Metrolink Ticket Machines.
- Applies to all Metrolink ticket types.
- In addition to existing discounts.

Student Adventure Pass

- Provides students passes at no cost
- Eligibility: K-12, trade school, community college, and university students with valid student ID
- Available on ticket machines and the mobile app
 - Students will automatically receive the pass when they have a Metrolink Mobile account with a verified school email.
- Includes existing transfer benefits and partnerships
- Unlimited rides and access system-wide
- 6-month pilot or until grant funds are exhausted







Metro Vanpool Program

- Program launched in May 2007
- Current number of vans: 800+
- As of January 2022, vanpools receive up to a \$600 monthly subsidy
- New Vanpool Bonus: \$200 for first month
- High-Occupancy Bonus: \$100 ongoing while 70% occupancy is maintained
- Leasing Vendor options: Enterprise, AVR, Green Commuter

METRO BIKE SHARE

225 stations in DTLA and Central LA (including Hollywood), North Hollywood and on the Westside.

1,800 Metro Bikes available including both Classic and Electric.

MBS PROGRAMS AND PROMOTIONS

Bike Share for Business

Employer pays \$89 for each employee and separately determines how much employees contribute.

Minimum commitment of (5) employee passes each year.

Pedal Perks

30-Day or 365-Day passholders can earn and accumulate points with each Metro Bike ride. Earn extra points for riding from full stations or returning bikes to empty ones. Use points to get limited-edition MBS gear!

What is Metro Micro?

Metro Micro is a microtransit pilot program, operating through March 31, 2025.

> Micro is Metro's on-demand rideshare service offering short trips (1-5 miles).

> Service with vehicles for up to 8 customers. Serves as a first/last mile option for bus and rail system users as well as stop-to-stop travel across the entire zone.

> Pay using a TAP card or credit card. TAP cards with stored value can be used directly on Metro Micro vans using a validator.







Proposed Project






- > Approximately 19-mile corridor with 22 enhanced stations

Preliminary Design: The project is now in the preliminary design stage before it enters into the start of final design and construction.








What is First/Last Mile?

A community-based process for improving transit rider's experience getting to and from Metro stations by walking, biking, or other means (such as wheelchairs, skateboard, scooter) First/Last Mile (FLM) Planning Goals:

- Create safe, accessible, and dignified pathways to transit
- Enhance routes that connect to stations
- Improve transfer experience



Trip Reduction Survey

- **21** Employers made up of **20,478** employees (and 14,986 peak hour commuters) submitted survey reports
- AVR scores in 2023 continued to decline from 2022 but still remain above 2019 pre-pandemic levels, despite the increase employees returning to work in person
- The weighted average Citywide AVR was 1.66, surpassing the citywide target for the fourth year in a row!

Telecommuting continued to decline from 41% in 2022 to 28% in 2023




The SOV rate increased to 67%, compared with 56% in 2022 and 85% before the pandemic



Sustainable trips including carpool, biking and transit trips also increased slightly since 2022 by .5%, .1% and .2% respectively



5% of drive-alone commutes were made using electric vehicles, compared to 3% in 2022
