

Burbank Aligns Parking Rules with State's New 'Daylighting' Law

Drivers in Burbank will see changes at intersections after the City Council voted Aug. 26 to adopt an ordinance aligning the city's parking code with California's new "daylighting" law.

Assembly Bill 413, which took effect Jan. 1, prohibits parking within 20 feet of the approach to a crosswalk — or within 15 feet where curb extensions are present. The rule applies even if the curb is unpainted and whether or not the crosswalk is striped, as state law considers any corner with a stop sign or curb ramp to be a crosswalk.

City officials said the change is designed to improve safety by "increasing visibility at intersections and reducing potential conflicts between drivers and pedestrians."


"Camera systems shown to reduce speeding might not be operational in Los Angeles until the end of 2026, a transportation engineer told officials Wednesday, putting the city behind some of its peers throughout the state that are also piloting the technology.

Elected officials expressed frustration with the delay at an L.A. City Council transportation committee meeting.

"It has been about two years since we approved this, and we're still talking about [requests for proposals]," L.A. City Councilmember Traci Park said. "I find that a little frustrating.""
