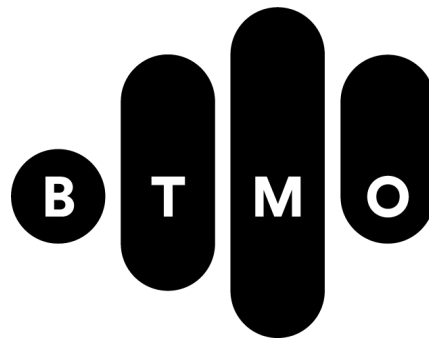

Don't miss kickoff! It is strongly encouraged to utilize local transit to get to the event:

- **Metrolink:** Via the **Downtown Burbank Station** on the Antelope Valley and Ventura County Lines. The Fan Zone is a **short walk or free shuttle ride** from the station. Use the [Metrolink SoCal Day Pass](#) for unlimited travel throughout the day.
- **Free BurbankBus shuttle:** Will operate between **Universal City/Studio City Station and the Fan Zone** approximately every 15 minutes.

- Metro B Line riders can connect via Universal City/Studio City Station.
- **Metro Bus: Multiple routes serve Downtown Burbank**, including **Lines 92, 94, 154, 155, 164, 165, 294, and 296**.

The event is expected to attract significant attendance – **please prepare for traffic and pedestrian congestion and commute delays** in and around the Burbank region. You can expect:

- Significant traffic congestion near **San Fernando Blvd., Magnolia Blvd., Angeleno Ave., Olive Ave., and adjacent Downtown streets**
- Increased traffic on regional routes serving Burbank, including **I-5, SR-134, SR-170, and US-101 connections**
- Increased demand and **crowding on Metrolink, Metro Bus, and BurbankBus services**
- **Longer travel times throughout the region**

If you are planning on traveling during the event, here are a few tips:

- Allow for additional time
- Avoid driving, if possible, especially near Downtown Burbank. Consider alternatives to driving; view transit options [here](#).
- Monitor traffic and transit conditions before traveling
 - *Traffic conditions:* quickmap.dot.ca.gov/
 - *Metro service and parking alerts:* metro.net/service/advisories/
 - *Metrolink service updates:* metrolinktrains.com/train_status/subscribe/
 - *BurbankBus service alerts:* rideburbankbus.com/announcements

Rail-to-Rail Shows What an Active Transportation Plan Can Do

The World Cup arrives in Los Angeles as both a spectacle and stress test. For a few weeks, the region will be asked to do what it has often promised but rarely delivered at scale: move people efficiently without surrendering the city to traffic. AB 2168 matters because it recognizes a simple truth hiding in plain sight — and not just for these rare mega events, but for everyday life in Southern California. Big transit investments need active transportation connections to work and make mode shift not just desirable but irresistible. Sidewalks, crossings, bike routes, and safe station access are not decorative. They are the connective tissue of a functioning transportation system.

A Positive Sign for L.A. Olympic Transportation Funding



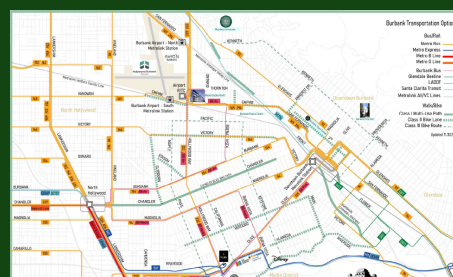
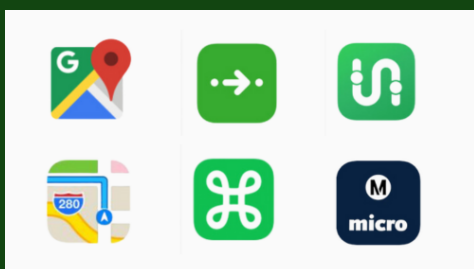

The House Appropriations Committee has approved \$875 million to fund public transportation for the 2028 Olympic Games, a positive sign for LA28 after the exclusion of Olympics transit funding from President Trump's fiscal year 2027 budget request this spring.

The funding must be passed by Congress in a future spending bill — part of a lengthy 2027 budgeting process that is underway now — but its approval in committee last week is a crucial signal of investment from Washington after weeks of uncertainty.
