



COMMUTE SURVEY – FALL 2026



HOW DOES IT WORK?

Average Vehicle Ridership (AVR) is a metric to **measure the number of people coming to or leaving a site vs. the number of cars**. The higher the number, the higher number of sustainable trips employees are taking to get to their work.



WHY SURVEY?

Burbank's **municipal code** requires some employers to survey employees about commute modes. It helps the City **understand travel patterns and improve transportation** options. **Participation is required** and supports better commuting services for everyone.



WHAT IS THE TARGET AVR?

The City has assigned an **AVR target of 1.61** to employers in the Media and Downtown districts. Employees are required to **reduce** their evening peak period **automobile travel by 38%**.



WHAT DOES THE SURVEY ASK?

It asks you **how you got to and from work over the identified survey week**. It collects data on basic information, such as home zip code and cross streets, and the mode of transportation for each day of the survey period. Data is not shared or sold.
